by a person who needs little or no introduction. Professor Daniel Brodie is the most published ECMO researcher of all time. Formerly Section Chief of Critical Care at NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital and Professor of Medicine at Columbia University, in March 2023 he moved to Baltimore to take up a new position as Vice President and Chief Medical Officer for Critical Care at Johns Hopkins. I have known Dan for nearly 15 years, have co-authored >50 publications with him, and have worked with him on ELSO's Executive Committee and Board of Directors for over 5 years. He possesses extremely keen intelligence, works devotedly to anything he signs up for, has tremendous intuition about how to best address problems, and is an emollient diplomat. In short, I can think of no-one better equipped to lead ELSO over the next two years. One of Sir Winston Churchill's lesser-known apophthegms reads,

"Most men sink into insignificance when they quit office. Very insignificant men acquire weight when they obtain it."

I look forward to sinking into insignificance while remaining supremely confident that Dan will not acquire any new weight when he takes over.

Before I leave, I must extend my thanks to all the ELSO Office staff: Victoria, Alex, Lauren, but in particular to Peter Rycus and Christine Stead. I have had literally hundreds of conference calls with them over the last 2 years, sometimes 3-4 times a week, and I'll miss our camaraderie. They work with a degree of utter dedication that most people in the ECMO community are probably unaware of, yet it is because of them that ELSO achieves what it does and functions at such a high level despite finite resources. To them go my deepest thanks and most profound admiration.

I must also give thanks to Professor Matthew Paden, our former President, who will step off the Board of Directors in the New Year. Matt is an extraordinary individual who led ELSO through the COVID-19 pandemic and has spent many hours lending the rest of us his wisdom. ELSO will miss his leadership and guidance.

A final thought regarding ECMO itself. Sir Roger Scruton, regarded as the "most important Anglo-American conservative thinker of his generation" (RP George, Princeton University, New York Times, 1/29/2020), wrote,

"Precisely because we live in a morbidly unheroic world – a world of cost-benefit calculation, in which gods and heroes have no place – we are driven to regard our own existence as some kind of cosmic mistake. If it is to have meaning, this can come only through a gesture that throws all calculation aside ... those moments in and out of time constitute our redemption: they are moments of consecration, in which life is shown to be worthwhile."

Sir Roger was not writing about ECMO but his words can be happily applied to it nonetheless. ECMO is an heroic form of life support used to prevent the most critically ill patients from dying. Using ECMO properly returns us to an earlier world of heroism in which cost-benefit calculations become irrelevant and the need to save a young person's life becomes the only consideration.

It is a long-standing tradition at ELSO meetings to toast to the memory of Robert E Gross, who supported Dr Bartlett in the 1960s when the latter gentleman proposed how to adapt cardiopulmonary bypass technology to ICU patients. I shall close with my own version of this traditional salute,

"Here's to the memory of Dr Robert E Gross ... and to the ongoing love and abiding affection we have for Dr Robert H Bartlett and Wanda Bartlett ... without whom none of us would be here."





How I Do It Webinars Save the date announcement! On January 22, 2025 at 1500 UTC (10am EST, 7am PST) ELSO will host a special webinar on remote management of ECMO patients. We are delighted to welcome Dr. Sandeep Dewan, Senior Director and Head of Critical Care and ECMO at Fortis Hospital, Gurugram, India to speak about his amazing work in developing a remotely managed ICU and ECMO program. Utilizing technology to expand access to high quality ECMO and ICU care is a foundational mission for Dr. Dewan that has applications across all types of healthcare systems. 
Dr. Bartlett was honored for his role in the development of extracorporeal membrane oxygenation (ECMO) and its life-saving impact on many patients over the years. Dr. Bartlett holds patents related to ECMO technology. He has also made contributions to critical care, acute kidney failure, and sustained hemofiltration.

ELSO congratulates Dr. Bartlett on this recognition. His contributions to the field of medicine and medical technology have improved and saved the lives of many patients. In the spirit of this award, which highlights innovation, we hope this will elevate the inspiration to even more young inventors. Congratulations!

SPECIAL EDITION IN MEMORIAM LUCIANO GATTINONI

Luciano Gattinoni was a giant in our field, a dear friend, an astute clinician, an inspiring mentor, a modern polymath, and a great scientist. A well-published scientist with over 500 publications, his career included international experience at the NIH in 1975 - 1977, where he became a colleague of Dr. Bartlett's in the ARDS and ECLS fields. At the University of Milan, he earned his professorship and was Chief of Intensive Care at Ospedale Maggiore Policlinico.

Prof Gattinoni's approach to life inspired many to do better. Advancements in practice that we attribute to his leadership and life's work include prone positioning, lung-protective ventilation, and extracorporeal CO2 removal. His lectures often referenced treating the individual patient, stressing the importance of combining both evidence-based medicine and the fundamentals of physiology. These principles were always part of his approach to clinical medicine and were evident throughout his life, reinforced earlier this year in a lecture given in Kuwait at SWAAC ELSO.

Prof Gattinoni was invited to pen the Foreword in the current edition of the ELSO Red Book. He wrote,

"Nobody knows the future, but I am pretty sure that the passion and enthusiasm which characterizes ECLS people, far more than other medical disciplines, will allow further dreams and advances. To these people, my Foreword is dedicated."



IN MEMORIAM: LUCIANO GATTINONI

What he said of others was also truly applicible to him. It is hard to imagine anyone with more passion and enthusiasm for his work. For over 50 years, he was among the core of world experts who explored and refined mechanical ventilation and extracorporeal gas exchange. We hope that all will pause in the coming days to take the time to acknowledge the life of our dear friend, Luciano Gattinoni. May he continue to inspire us for decades to come.

APELSO Updates

• Adult ECMO Comprehensive Simulation Course: Held in September 2024 in Hong Kong, hosted by Queen Mary Hospital, the University of Hong Kong, and Grantham Hospital. Nearly 60 participants attended this 4-day course, focusing on ECMO simulation.

From November 14 to 16, 2024, the VI ELSO LATAM Congress was held in Argentina. The city of Buenos Aires became the epicenter of knowledge exchange in ECMO, bringing together specialists from Latin America, the United States, Canada, Europe and Asia. As president of the ELSO LATAM

The task was a great team effort, and my recognition to: Gisela Ponce (General Secretary), Maria Luisa Pilan (Scientific Secretary) and a working group that included members of 18 ECMO centers in Argentina. There were also impressive workshops led by Dr. Juan Manuel Torrillas and Dr. Mariela Krynski where 4 pediatric scenarios and 4 adult scenarios of high

fidelity simulation and cannulation were performed by 4 hospitals of Argentina and 1 of Brazil. It was exciting to share practical advice and work with simulation models, key tools to perfect fundamental techniques in different clinical scenarios.

If you have been reading our newsletters, you must appreciate the caliber of contributions from Graeme MacLaren. It has been a privilege for us all to have your time and thoughtful guidance - and vocabulary! Thank you, Graeme, for your leadership of ELSO these past two years.
